Wednesday, Feb 15 at 7:00 pm - The BU Weis Center presents Vance Gilbert - Live Jazz/Free - Philadelphia born and raised acoustic artist, Vance Gilbert burst onto Boston's singer/songwriter scene in the early '90s. His recordings have been variously celebrated for their lyrical sensibility, jazz quartet approach, and innocence/wisdom while he presents "with the voice of an angel, the wit of a devil, and the guitar playing of a god." In *Up in Rockfield*, considered to be his career-crowning achievement, Gilbert "unflinchingly renders blame and absolution, trapped hearts and free-riders, class and station, uncertainty and resolution, the spiritual and the visceral, the forever and the now, all side by side. His is a presentation steeped in deep humanism and bravery, stunning artistry and soul, and unbridled joy..."

Thursday, Feb 23 at 8:00 - Moving Pictures: Civil Rights Imagery and Improvisation – Live Performance/Free - Music provided unity, strength, and inspiration throughout the Civil Rights Movement while iconic photographs aroused awareness and solidarity on the evening news and in the morning paper. Bucknell faculty members Barry Long (flugelhorn) and Phil Haynes (drums) join Susquehanna faculty Joshua Davis (bass), and saxophonist David Pope (James Madison University) for an evening of improvised jazz portrayed against the backdrop of moving imagery on the big screen.

SYNOPSIS

[A Good Man](#) – 90 min., Documentary, Directed by Gordon Quinn and Bob Hercules (2011). This documentary illustrates the work of director/choreographer Bill T. Jones over the course of two years. The film will be introduced by Bucknell University Professor of English and the director of the Griot Institute Carmen Gillespie.

[The Adventures of Tintin](#) – Rated PG, 107 min - Animation/Action/Adventure. Director: Steven Spielberg, Stars Jamie Bell, Andy Serkis and Daniel Craig. Intrepid reporter Tintin and Captain Haddock set off on a treasure hunt for a sunken ship commanded by Haddock's ancestor.

[The Artist](#) – Rated PG-13 - 100 min - Comedy/Romance/Drama; Director: Michel Hazanavicius, Stars: Jean Dujardin, Bérénice Bejo & John Goodman. Hollywood, 1927: As silent movie star George Valentin wonders if the arrival of talking pictures will cause him to fade into oblivion, he sparks with Peppy Miller, a young dancer set for a big break.

[The Birds](#) – 119 min., Horror/Thriller, Directed by Alfred Hitchcock (1963). Starring Tippi Hedren, Rod Taylor, and Suzanne Pleshette. Melanie Daniels (Hedren) visits Mitch Brenner (Taylor) and his family in Bodega Bay. Upon her arrival, the local wildlife begin to act strangely.

[The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo](#) - Rated R, 158 min - Crime/Drama/Mystery , Directed by David Fincher. Starring Daniel Craig and Rooney Mara. This English-language adaptation of the Swedish novel by Stieg Larsson follows a disgraced journalist, Mikael Blomkvist , as he investigates the disappearance of a wealthy patriarch's niece from 40 years ago. He is aided by the pierced, tattooed, punk computer hacker named Lisbeth Salander. As they work together in the investigation, Blomkvist and Salander uncover immense corruption beyond anything they have ever imagined.

[Ice Age](#) - Rated PG, 81 min - Animation/Adventure/Comedy. Directed by Chris Wedge, Carlos Saldanha. Stars Ray Romano, John Leguizamo, & Denis Leary. Back when the Earth was being overrun by glaciers, and animals were scurrying to save themselves from the upcoming Ice Age, a stupid sloth named Sid, a woolly mammoth named Manny, and a saber-toothed tiger named Diego are forced to become unlikely heroes. The three reluctantly come together when they have to return a human child to its father while braving the deadly elements of the impending Ice Age.

[The Interrupters](#) – 125 min., Documentary, Directed by Steve James (2011). From the director of *Hoop Dreams*, this critically acclaimed documentary focuses on a number of people like Cobe Williams and Ameena Matthews, who are attempting to stop the cycles of violence on the streets of Chicago.

[Invasion of the Body Snatchers](#) – 115 min., Horror/Sci-Fi, Directed by Philip Kaufman (1978). Starring Donald Sutherland, Brook Adams, and Jeff Goldblum. In this terrifying remake of the 1956 Science Fiction classic, Matthew Bennell (Sutherland) tries to uncover the mystery of recent events in town.

[Mon Oncle](#) – 117 min., Comedy, Directed by Jacques Tati (1958). Starring Jacques Tati, Jean-Pierre Zola, and Adrienne Servantie. Monsieur Hulot (Tati) cares not for the modern life of his sister (Servantie) and her husband Charles (Zola). Instead, he focuses on the simple pleasures, including his time with his nephew, much to Charles' chagrin. French with English subtitles.

[My Week With Marilyn](#) – rated R, 99 min, Drama. Director: Simon Curtis. Actors: Michelle Williams, Eddie Redmayne, Julia Ormond and Kenneth Branagh. Colin Clark, an employee of Sir Laurence Olivier's, documents the tense interaction between Olivier and Marilyn Monroe during production of *The Prince and the Showgirl*.

Oscar Shorts – Watch the films nominated for the 2012 Academy of Motion Picture Arts & Sciences' Oscar Awards in the category of Live Action Short Film, Animated Short Film and Documentary Short Film (titles tba).

[Roman Holiday](#) - NR, 118 min - Comedy/Drama/Romance, Director: William Wyler, Stars: Gregory Peck, Audrey Hepburn and Eddie Albert. Bored and sheltered princess escapes her guardians and falls in love with an American newsman in Rome.

[The Story of Stuff](#) – 60 min., Documentary, Directed by Louis Fox (2007). *The Story of Stuff* project created several documentaries to inform and educate the public about the things people buy and consume. Samantha Pearson, of the Local Action Network, will lead a post-screening discussion.

[To Be Heard](#) – 87 min., Documentary, Directed by Roland Legiardi-Laura, Edwin Martinez, Deborah Shaffer and Amy Sultan (2010). This film follows three teenagers as they begin to write poetry. The film will be introduced by Bucknell University Professor of English and the Director of the Stadler Center for Poetry Shara McCallum.

[War Horse](#) – rated PG-13, 146 min - Drama/History/War, Director: Steven Spielberg, Stars: Jeremy Irvine, Emily Watson and David Thewlis. Young Albert enlists to service in WWI after his beloved horse, Joey, is sold to the cavalry. Albert's hopeful journey takes him out of England and across Europe as the war rages on.
