EXHIBITION ON SCREEN – In 2011 Seventh Art Productions created history when they brought major art exhibitions into cinemas across the globe with Leonardo Live from London's National Gallery. This was the first ever exhibition from a gallery or museum on the big screen. This led on to **Exhibition On Screen** – creating from scratch a worldwide network of over 1500 cinemas showing regular arts films in over 60 countries. SYNOPSIS OF UPCOMING FILMS

BLACK BAG (2025 – R) 1 hr. 33 min. Spy Drama. When intelligence agent Kathryn Woodhouse is suspected of betraying the nation, her husband - also a legendary agent - faces the ultimate test of whether to be loyal to his marriage, or his country.

BOB TREVINO LIKES IT (2024 – PG-13) 1hr. 41 min. Comedy/Drama. When lonely 20-something Lily Trevino accidentally befriends a stranger online who shares the same name as her own self-centered father, encouragement and support from this new Bob Trevino could change her life.

DIVINE SECRETS OF THE YA-YA SISTERHOOD (2002 – PG-13) 1 hr. 56 min. Drama. After years of mother-daughter tension, Siddalee receives a scrapbook detailing the wild adventures of the "Ya-Yas", her mother's girlhood friends.

EXHIBITION ON SCREEN: TOKYO STORIES (2023 – NR) 1hr. 30 min. Documentary. Based on a major exhibition at the Ashmolean in Oxford, Tokyo Stories spans 400 years of incredibly dynamic art - ranging from the delicate woodblock prints of Hokusai and Hiroshige, to Pop Art posters, contemporary photography, Manga, film, and brand-new artworks that were created on the streets. The exhibition was a smash-hit five-star success and brought a younger and more diverse audience to the museum. The film uses the exhibition as a launchpad to travel to Tokyo itself, and explore the art and artists of the city more fully.

THE FRIEND (2024 – R) 1 hr. 59 min. Drama. When a solitary writer adopts and bonds with a Great Dane that belonged to a late friend, she begins to come to terms with her past and her own creative inner life.

HOUSE (HAUSU) (1977 – NR) 1 hr. 28 min. Horror. A schoolgirl and six of her classmates travel to her aunt's country home, which turns out to be haunted.

MADAGASCAR 3: EUROPE'S MOST WANTED (2012 – PG) 1 hr. 33 min. Family/Animation. The Madagascar animals join a struggling European circus to get back to New York, but find themselves being pursued by a psychotic animal-control officer.

MY MAN GODFREY (1936 NR) 1 hr. 34 min. Comedy. A scatterbrained socialite hires a vagrant as a family butler - but there's more to Godfrey than meets the eye.

THE PENGUIN LESSONS (2024 – PG-13) 1 hr. 51 min. Drama. A disillusioned Englishman who goes to work in a school in a divided Argentina in 1976 finds his life transformed when he rescues an orphaned penguin from the beach.

ROSEMARY'S BABY (1968 – R) 2 hrs. 17 min. Horror. A young couple trying for a baby moves into an aging, ornate apartment building on Central Park West, where they find themselves surrounded by peculiar neighbors.

SINGING IN THE RAIN (1952 – G) 1 hr. 43 min. Musical. A silent film star falls for a chorus girl just as he and his delusional jealous screen partner are trying to make the difficult transition to talking pictures in 1920s Hollywood.

STAR WARS: A NEW HOPE (1977 – PG) 2 hrs. 1 min. Sci-Fi. Luke Skywalker joins forces with a Jedi Knight, a cocky pilot, a Wookiee and two droids to save the galaxy from the Empire's world-destroying battle station, while also attempting to rescue Princess Leia from the mysterious Darth Vader.

STAR WARS: THE EMPIRE STRIKES BACK (1980 – PG) 2 hrs. 4 min. Sci-Fi. After the Empire overpowers the Rebel Alliance, Luke Skywalker begins training with Jedi Master Yoda, while Darth Vader and bounty hunter Boba Fett pursue his friends across the galaxy.
