An estimated 16.8 million people in the U.S. are caring for a child with disabilities or complex medical needs. The demands of daily life and chronic stress can negatively affect the mental and physical wellbeing of parent caregivers. With limited accommodations and uncertainty about the future, caregivers often face isolation and exhaustion. In **Unseen**, parents are brutally honest about their experience. Video diaries from diverse caregivers featured in the film illustrate the universality of the topics explored, while interviews with mental health and legal experts provide a broader view on the societal impacts. **Event is free. SYNOPSIS OF UPCOMING FILMS

THE AI DOC: OR HOW I BECAME AN APOCALOPTIMIST (2026 – PG-13) 1 hr. 44 min. Documentary. A father-to-be tries to figure out what is happening with all this AI insanity.

CHAMPIONS OF THE GOLDEN VALLEY (2024 – NR) 1 hr. 21 min. Documentary. Afghan youth craft wooden skis to compete in a mountain race uniting rival villages before their country's collapse, showing resilience and community spirit in an unexpected story of hope and triumph.

THE CHRISTOPHERS (2025 – R) 1 hr. 40 min. Comedy/Drama. The children of a once famous artist hire a forger to complete some unfinished, long ago abandoned canvases so they'll have an inheritance when he dies.

THE COMEDY OF TERRORS (1964 – NR) 1 hr. 24 min. Dark Comedy. A New England undertaker orders his henchman to make some business.

THE DRAMA (2026 – R) 1 hr. 45 min. Romantic Comedy. A happily-engaged couple is put to the test when an unexpected turn sends their wedding week off the rails.

HIDDEN FIGURES (2016 – PG) 2 hrs. 7 min. Drama. Three female African-American mathematicians play a pivotal role in astronaut John Glenn's launch into orbit while dealing with racial and gender discrimination.

MOMMIE DEAREST (1981 – R) 2 hrs. 9 min. Drama. The abusive and traumatic adoptive upbringing of Christina Crawford at the hands of her mother, screen queen Joan Crawford, is depicted.

POSSESSED (1933 – NR) 1 hr. 16 min. Drama. An ambitious factory girl meets a handsome, wealthy lawyer, but he's interested in her as a mistress, not a wife.

PROJECT HAIL MARY (2026 – PG-13) 2 hrs. 36 min. Sci-Fi Drama. A science teacher wakes up alone on a spaceship. As his memory returns, he uncovers a mission to stop a mysterious substance killing Earth's sun and that an unexpected friendship may be the key.

THE SUPER MARIO GALAXY MOVIE (2026 – PG) 1 hr. 38 min. Animation. Mario ventures into space, exploring cosmic worlds and tackling galactic challenges far from the familiar Mushroom Kingdom.

STAND BY ME (1986 – R) 1 hr. 29 min. Drama/Adventure. A writer recounts a childhood journey with his friends to view the body of a boy who went missing in the woods.

STAR WARS: A NEW HOPE (1977 – PG) 2 hrs. 1 min. Sci-Fi. A farm boy joins forces with various allies to save their galaxy from the evil Empire's planet-destroying battle station, while also rescuing the princess leading the rebellion against them.

STAR WARS: THE EMPIRE STRIKES BACK (1980 – PG) 2 hrs. 4 min. Sci-Fi. After the Empire overpowers the Rebel Alliance, Luke Skywalker begins training with Jedi Master Yoda, while Darth Vader and bounty hunter Boba Fett pursue his friends across the galaxy.

THE TRUFFLE HUNTERS (2020 – PG-13) 1 hr. 24 min. Documentary. Deep in the forests of Piedmont, Italy, a handful of men, seventy or eighty years old, hunt for the rare and expensive white Alba truffle-which to date has resisted all of modern science's efforts at cultivation.

UNSEEN: HOW WE'RE FAILING PARENT CAREGIVERS & WHY IT MATTERS (2022 – NR) 46 min. Documentary. This award-winning documentary examines the emotional, physical, and financial toll placed on parent caregivers of children and adults with disabilities or complex medical needs. The film centers on unfiltered, compelling stories, cultivates compassion and serves as a catalyst for change for caregivers in our communities.

WAIT UNTIL DARK (1967 – NR) 1 hr. 48 min. Thriller. A recently blinded woman is terrorized by a trio of thugs while they search for a heroin-stuffed doll they believe is in her apartment.
