





SYNOPSIS OF UPCOMING FILMS

BACK TO THE FUTURE (1985 – PG) 1 hr. 56 min. Teen/Comedy. Marty McFly, a 17-year-old high school student, is accidentally sent 30 years into the past in a time-traveling DeLorean invented by his close friend, the maverick scientist Doc Brown.

THE BAD GUYS (2022 – PG) 1 hr. 40 min. Animation/Family. To avoid prison, a gang of notorious animal criminals pretends to seek being rehabilitated, only for their leader to realize that he genuinely wants to change his ways.

CHICKEN RUN (2000 – G) 1hr.24 min. Animation/Family. When a cockerel apparently flies into a chicken farm, the chickens see him as an opportunity to escape their evil owners.

THE CHRISTOPHERS (2025 – R) 1 hr. 40 min. Comedy/Drama. The children of a once famous artist hire a forger to complete some unfinished, long ago abandoned canvases so they'll have an inheritance when he dies.

DOUBLE INDEMNITY (1944 – NR) 1 hr. 47 min. Crime/Drama. An insurance representative is seduced by a dissatisfied housewife into a scheme of insurance fraud and murder that arouses the suspicion of his colleague, a claims investigator

FERNGULLY: THE LAST RAINFOREST (1992 – G) 1 hr. 16 min. Animation/Family. The magical inhabitants of a rainforest fight to save their home, which is threatened by logging and a polluting force of destruction called Hexxus.

H IS FOR HAWK (2025 – PG-13) 1 hr. 59 min. Documentary. After losing her beloved father, Helen finds herself saved by an unlikely friendship with a stubborn hawk named Mabel.

THE LEGO MOVIE 2: THE SECOND PART (2019 – PG) 1 hr. 47 min. Animation/Family. It's been five years since everything was awesome and the citizens are facing the huge new threat of Lego Duplo, invaders from outer space, wrecking everything faster than they can rebuild.

MICHAEL (2026 – PG-13) 2 hrs. 7 min. Drama. The early life of musician Michael Jackson, from the discovery of his talent as the lead of the Jackson Five to the artist whose creative ambition fueled a pursuit to become the biggest entertainer in the world.

MIGRATION (2023 – PG) 1 hr. 23 min. Animation/Family. A family of ducks try to convince their overprotective father to go on the vacation of a lifetime.

MUPPET TREASURE ISLAND (1996 – G) 1 hr. 39 min. Sea Adventure/Family. The Muppets set sail in search of treasure, with Jim Hawkins and Long John Silver.

POKEMON: DETECTIVE PICACHU (2019 – PG) 1 hr. 44 min. Adventure/Family. In a world where people collect Pokémon to do battle, a boy comes across an intelligent talking Pikachu who seeks to be a detective.

RARE: A RARE DISEASE REVOLUTION (2025 NR) 1 hr. 25 min. Documentary. RARE shares the powerful stories of families navigating life with rare diseases and the unexpected heroes driving hope, advocacy, and scientific progress.

ROCKETMAN (2019 – R) 2 hrs. 1 min. Rock Drama. The musical fantasy about Elton John's breakthrough years, from his time as a prodigy at the Royal Academy of Music through his influential and enduring musical partnership with Bernie Taupin.

SHREK 2 (2004 – PG) 1 hr. 33 min. Animation/Family. Shrek and Fiona travel to the Kingdom of Far Far Away, where Fiona's parents are King and Queen, to celebrate their marriage. When they arrive, they find they are not as welcome as they thought they would be.

THE SHEEP DETECTIVES (2026 – PG) 1 hr. 49 min. Animation. Every night a shepherd reads aloud a murder mystery, pretending his sheep can understand. When he is found dead, the sheep realize at once that it was a murder and think they know everything about how to go about solving it.

SING 2 (2021 – PG) 1 hr. 50 min. Animation/Family. Buster Moon and his friends must persuade reclusive rock star Clay Calloway to join them for the opening of a new show.

SOUL (2020 – PG) 1 hr. 40 min. Animation. Joe is a middle-school band teacher whose life hasn't quite gone the way he expected. His true passion is jazz. But when he travels to another realm to help someone find their passion, he soon discovers what it means to have soul.

TANGLED (2010 – PG) 1 hr. 40 min. Animation/Family. The magically long-haired Rapunzel has spent her entire life in a tower, but now that a runaway thief has stumbled upon her, she is about to discover the world for the first time, and who she really is.

THE WIZARD OF OZ (1939 – G) 1 hr. 42 min. Fantasy/Family. Young Dorothy Gale and her dog Toto are swept away by a tornado from their Kansas farm to the magical Land of Oz and embark on a quest with three new friends to see the Wizard, who can return her to her home and fulfill the others' wishes.

YOU, ME & TUSCANY (2026 – PG-13) 1 hr. 45 min. Romantic Comedy. When a woman crashes at an empty Italian villa, posing as the owner's fiancée, she discovers an unexpected romance that could transform her life.
