SYNOPSIS OF UPCOMING FILMS

CLOUDY WITH A CHANCE OF MEATBALLS (2009 – PG) 1 hr. 30 min. Animation. An eccentric inventor is regarded as a failure within his isolated community until he creates a machine that can make it rain food.

HADESTOWN: THE MUSICAL (2026 – NR) 2 hrs. 21 min. Musical. A musical juxtaposition of the Orpheus/Eurydice and Hades/Persephone myths that examine the way real life can impact our quest for a perfect world.

THE INVITE (2026 – R) 1 hr. 47 min. Comedy. Joe and Angela's marriage is on thin ice. When they invite their enigmatic upstairs neighbors for a dinner party, the night spirals into unexpected places.

MOSES THE BLACK (2026 – NR) 1 hr. 44 min. Drama. The story of a gangster in modern day Chicago inspired by an incredible story of repentance of the 4th century saint of the same name.

NO CHAINS, NO MASTERS (2024 – NR) 1 hr. 38 min. Drama. Massamba and his daughter Mati, slaves on Eugène Larcenet's plantation, hatch a daring plan to escape slavery, braving numerous obstacles in their pursuit of freedom.

THE ODYSSEY (2026 – R) 2hrs. 52 min. Adventure Epic. After the Trojan War, Odysseus faces a dangerous voyage back to Ithaca, meeting creatures like the Cyclops Polyphemus, Sirens, and Calypso along the way.

SPIDERMAN: BRAND NEW DAY (2026 – PG-13) 2 hrs. 25 min. Action Adventure. A forgotten Peter Parker lives alone as a full-time Spider-Man until mounting pressure triggers a dangerous change and a powerful new enemy emerges.

TONY (2026 – R) 1 hr. 46 min. Drama. A 19-year-old Anthony Bourdain travels to Provincetown and stumbles into the chaotic world of a restaurant kitchen, setting off a summer that will shape the course of his life.

+ **Friday, September 11 at 7:00pm – No Chains, No Masters, Dir. Simon Moutairou – The first film in a year-long Écrans Francophones series.** Mauritius, 1759. On the island's French-run sugar plantations, the enslaved live in constant fear. Sixteen-year-old Mati refuses to accept her fate. One night she flees toward a rumored community of runaways deep in the interior. Her escape triggers a ruthless manhunt: the plantation owner hires a merciless slave catcher and her sons to track her down. Knowing what capture would mean, her father, Massamba, breaks his chains and follows her into the jungle — a desperate fight for survival, and a final break from the colonial system. **Presented by the French and Francophone Studies Program, the College of Arts and Sciences and the Albertine Cinémathèque. + **Saturday, September 12 at 1:00 PM – Moses the Black** – Recently released from prison, Malik (Omar Epps), a feared gang leader from Chicago's West Side, returns home determined to avenge the murder of his closest friend, Sayeed. His loyal right-hand, Mike (Corey Hendrix), tries to hold their crew together as hotheaded members like 2wo 3ree (Wiz Khalifa) and Meechie (Skilla Baby) push for retaliation. His grandmother, a god-fearing woman who raised him, leaves Malik a small icon of St. Moses the Black -- whose story begins to shadow him with visions he can't ignore. As rival gangs -- led by a ruthless leader (Quavo) -- and a corrupt cop (Cliff Chamberlain) close in, and with the streets edging toward all-out war, Malik must confront a past that refuses to let go -- and the most dangerous threat of all: the enemy within. **FREE SCREENING sponsored by the Bucknell Orthodox Christian Fellowship with the Office of Religious and Spiritual Life, and St. John's Orthodox Church.**
